

**St Joseph's Retreat: Week 4**

This week, we continued to look at some of the titles given to St Joseph:

**Joseph Most Prudent:** In every situation in life, St. Joseph is a model of prudence. Supernatural prudence is different to human prudence. Human prudence guides a person to avoid difficulty, suffering, and hardship. Supernatural prudence does not seek to avoid suffering but embraces the cross out of love and always strives for the greater good. By God's grace, St Joseph's prudence was supernatural and heroic. He ponders, prays, discerns, and acts.

**Joseph Most Courageous:** St Joseph was courageous and fearless. He sacrificed everything for love of Jesus and Mary. Jesus himself learned courage from the example of his foster father. St Joseph will help us to be courageous. With him as our spiritual father, we have nothing to be afraid of.

**Joseph Most Obedient:** St Joseph is a model of obedience. Obedience requires trust and Mary and Joseph were certain that God had their best interests in mind. St Joseph will increase in us the virtue of obedience.

**Joseph Most Faithful:** A Christian's relationship with God is a spiritual marriage. It requires mutual love, sacrifice, and faithfulness. St Joseph is the model of faith and trust. He knows who Jesus is and trusts in him. He exercised an active, trusting and zealous faith and he will increase our faith in Jesus.

**Mirror of Patience:** Patience is a virtue that many find hard to practice, especially in our fast-paced world. St Joseph is a model of patience. Life wasn't easy for him. Yet, in every situation and trial, St Joseph was always peaceful, kind, calm and abandoned to God's will. He wasn't perturbed by the challenges he faced. We experience many trials in life and God allows such trials because he wants us to grow in virtue. St Joseph will help us to grow in patience.

**Lover of Poverty:** When the Child Jesus was presented in the Temple, Joseph couldn't afford to purchase a lamb for a burnt offering. He could only offer a poor man's gift, that is, two turtledoves or two pigeons. The Holy Family lived on Divine Providence. They trusted that God would provide for their needs and He did. St Joseph will help us to be detached from material things and abandoned to Divine Providence. We find our true happiness in God alone.

Pope Francis composed this prayer to St Joseph. Please pray it each day of the retreat:

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,  
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.  
To you God entrusted his only Son;  
in you Mary placed her trust;  
with you Christ became man.*

show yourself a father  
and guide us in the path of life.  
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,  
and defend us from every evil. Amen.*
