Appointment of Bishop Francis Duffy as Archbishop of Tuam: We congratulate Bishop Francis Duffy, a native of Bawnboy, on his appointment as Archbishop of Tuam. Francis Duffy was born on 21 April 1958 in the parish of Templeport, Co Cavan to parents Mary Catherine Dolan and Frank Duffy. He attended primary school at Munlough National School, Bawnboy, and completed his post-primary education at Saint Patrick’s College, Cavan. Francis studied for the priesthood at Saint Patrick’s College, Maynooth and was ordained a priest for the diocese of Kilmore on 20 June 1982 in Saint Mogue’s Church, Bawnboy, Co Cavan by Bishop Francis MacKiernan. He taught at Saint Patrick’s College, Cavan, and was appointed principal of Fatima and Felim’s Secondary School, Ballinamore, Co Leitrim in 1996. After twelve years as principal Father Francis was appointed Diocesan Secretary and Financial Administrator and Chancellor. During that time he was resident priest in the parish of Laragh, Co Cavan. On 17 July 2021 he was appointed Bishop of Ardagh and Clonmacnois with his episcopal ordination taking place on 6 October 2013 at Saint Mary’s Church, Athlone.

The Bishops of Ireland will undertake a pilgrimage to the International shrine in Knock and will concelebrate Mass for all those who have died in our country during the pandemic at 3pm today, the 14th of November. **Kilmore Diocese will be represented by Bishop Martin and the Cullen family, from Oughteragh parish, who have been recently bereaved. It will be broadcast on the RTE News Now channel.**

Year of St Joseph Mass: Pope Francis proclaimed this to be a special year of devotion to St Joseph. To celebrate this year, a votive Mass in honour of St Joseph will be celebrated this Friday, the 19th of November at 8pm in St Patrick’s Church, Kilnavart. Fr Thomas Small will be the main celebrant. Fr Thomas is from Milltown and he was ordained by Bishop Martin Hayes in September 2020 in Belturbet. He is currently ministering as a curate in Cavan parish and he is a carpenter by trade. The Mass will be followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. There is a petition box in the sanctuary and people can now write and submit their intentions. You are invited to pray the Novena prayer printed on this newsletter to St Joseph each day until Friday. The Mass will be streamed on the parish Facebook page and broadcast on FM108. All are welcome to attend.

Candlelit Mass of Consolation: We will gather as a parish community on Tuesday, the 30th of November at 8pm in St Mogue’s Church, Bawnboy, to pray for all our deceased and to ask God to console those who are grieving for them. Prayers will be offered for those who died throughout the pandemic and for their families and a personalised candle will be lit for the deceased from the three church areas who died since last November.
